hereby apply for an order under section 53(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981
modifying the definitive map and statement for the county of Kent by upgrading to a
restricted byway the bridleway EE269 formerly known as Green Lane Road:

The way begins to the north of Goodnestone at the junction of Cave Lane, Goodnestone
Hill and Goodnestone Road, at Ordnance Survey grid reference TR25565553, following
the parish boundary between Goodnestone and Wingham leading 410m southwest to
Goodnestone Gap (TR25305522), then, still following the parish boundary and the
northwest boundary of Goodnestone Park, continuing 520m southwest, then south-
southwest, resuming southwest, to where the parish boundary turns to the northwest
(TR25025478), then continuing 620m southwest along the northwest boundary of
Goodnestone Park, to the junction of Love Lane and Hallsdown Road at Goodnestone
Park Upper Corner or Stone Cross (TR24715424).
